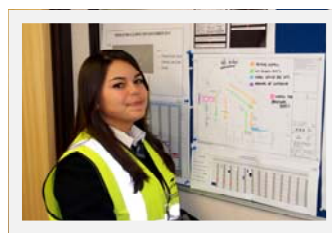
LBTS6 Open Evening

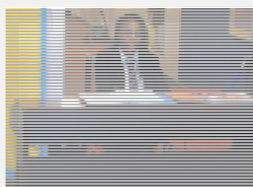
JACK PETCHEY AWARD



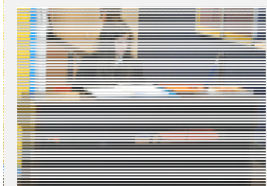

PRESENTATION EVENING

ACADEMY STATUS

LBTS has applied to the Government to be an Academy following the recent consultation. We expect to convert during Summer 2012. There will be no immediate changes but we hope that over the next 3 years we can:

- ◆ Offer a more specialist curriculum for those students who need extra help in English and Maths.
- ◆ Use the support of the Royal Society of Arts to improve the careers advice and support we offer by linking our students to their members. The Royal Society of Arts is an international body of 27,000 professionals who promote a wide range of activities.

UNIFORM

We have decided, after consultation with students, to improve our uniform. All Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 students will be issued with their new blazer and tie in early summer. We will not be changing the uniform for Y11 as they are leaving soon.



PARENTPAY

All parent/carers should have received logon details for Parentpay which allows you to pay for your child's lunch / breaktime snacks via the internet. The letter which contains the logon details also contains a bar-code which you can use to pay via Paypoint too.

If you have not received or have misplaced this, please contact Candice Nash at the school to request a new copy.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Students are entitled to have a free school meal if parents are receiving Income Support / Income-Based Job Seekers' Allowance, Asylum Seeker, Pensioner or in receipt of Child Tax Credit (and your income is no more than £16,190).

If you think your child is eligible please do not miss out. Fill in the enclosed form and return to the school along with proof.

Bring one of the following:

- ◆ A letter from the Job Centre plus (DWP) less than 3 months old confirming the type of benefit and current eligibility. If you receive Income Support, Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance or Income-based Employment & Support Allowance, your letter must state the words Income-based.
- ◆ Your Tax Credit Award Notice TC602 for 2011/12 from the Inland Revenue showing entitlement to Child Tax Credit ONLY (with no Working Tax Credit payment) with a gross income assessed by the Inland Revenue of £16,190 or less.
- ◆ Pension Credit Award Notice for 2011/12 including assessment pages.
- ◆ Confirmation of current support from the National Asylum Support Service (NASS) or a Social Services Asylum Team.

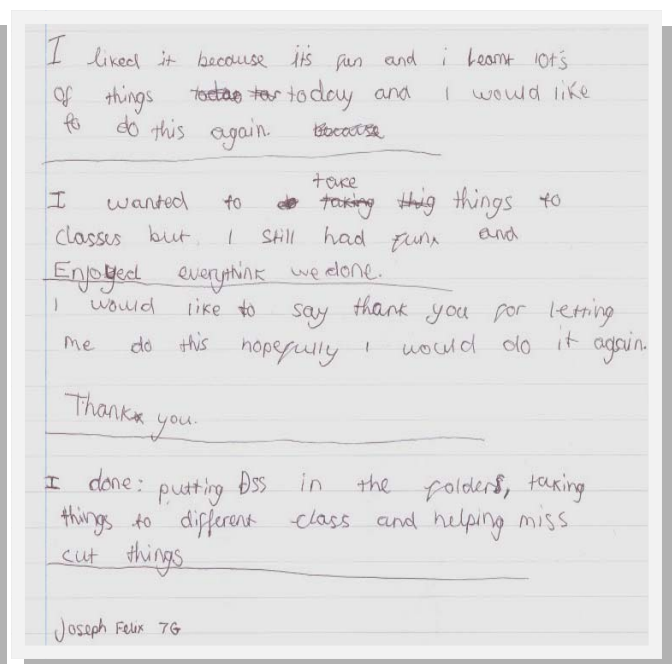
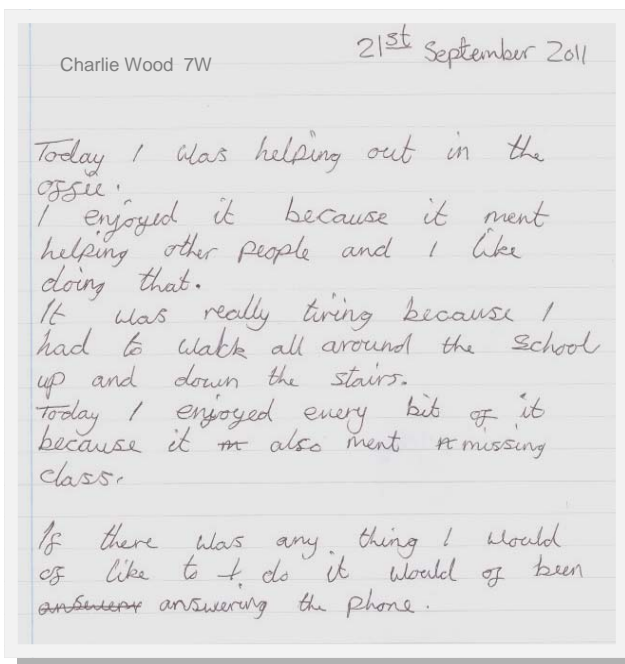
Students currently accommodated with foster carers are not entitled to a free school meal.

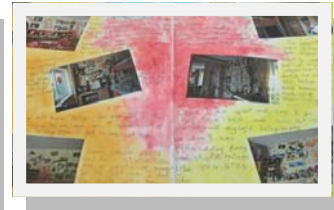
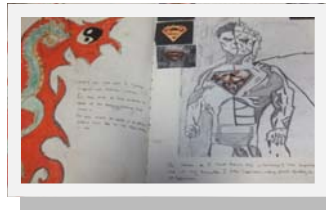


Year 11 Art - Exceptional work has been created this term by the BTEC Art students working on their 3D Unit and final pieces.

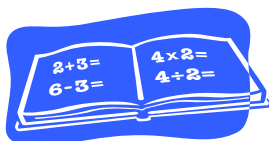
Living Eggs

Years 7 & 8 will be observing living eggs hatch into chicks from 3pm till 4pm in room 2.12 from Monday 20th February 2012.

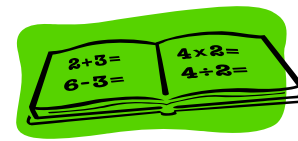
