

BBC School Report

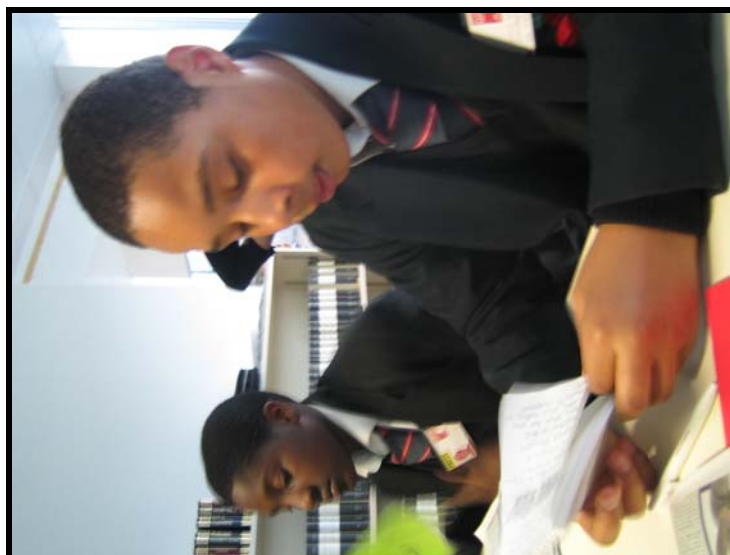
Year 8 – March 22nd 2007
